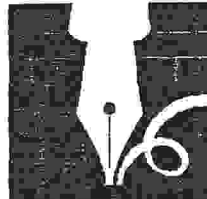
The Shuffle Courts have been refinished. Get out and practice, and sign up with Charlie Hicks for the team.
